- 1. Under the Plan tab for High School Students, what is UCanGo2.org's definition of college? College refers to all types—of training after high school: career technology centers, trade/proprietary schools, community colleges, regional and comprehensive universities.

Could be any of the following:

- Do you have any information about careers that would match my skills and talents?
- What classes will I have to take in high school in order to graduate and be ready for college?

- Study with friends.
- Ask for help.
